If you run out of minutes don't worry the game ends, you can continue playing, but there will be consequences at the end of the game.

The big blackboard on the far wall feels a little out of place, in this cabin in the woods, but you have heard some of the academical types saying you just can't beat old fashioned chalk. It is full of complicated looking equations. You can't make heads or tails of most of it, symbols that you have only seen in science fiction shows. But one bit does stand at to you, in the right corner you noticed something that does not appear to be part of the equation. Some of the letters are smudged behind comprehension

Bookcases West wall (1 time)

The bookcases on the left take up the entire left side of the cabin wall to wall. There must be hundreds of books in here. How does professor Abigail have time to read all these? As you scan the books you notice a distinct grouping.

The leftmost bookcase

contains books that are old, decades or even centuries old, enormous toms, leatherbound, some nearly falling apart at the seem, others in more decent shape. All of the subjects are deffinetly physics related, although they seem a bit outdated for his line of work maybe he collects them (2 time)

You peer carefull inspect the left bookcase, looking for any books that have been recently moved, nothing jumps out to you. On a whim, you pick out the least damaged one, flicking through it, perhaps he left some notes, or a secret compartment. At least you can mostly understand some of it with your high school knowledge of physics. No secret notes, or the likes, but at the very back of the book you do find an overview of some of the terms used in this book.

The middle bookcase

contains much more modern books of a more standardized shape. Bed 1 time

A nice, comfy looking one person bed, soft covers, fancy linnen no expenses spared to sleep after spending all day theorising about atoms, or molecules of whatever it is proffesor Abigail does all day. Neatly made which fits the character you feel around and find nothing, You lift the bed slightly away from the wall to see if anything is lodged between there. 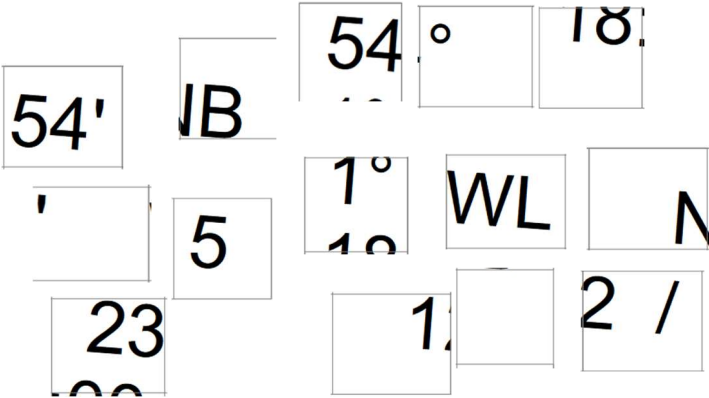
